### Building Sustainable Communities Program

The Building Sustainable Communities Program fosters thriving sustainable communities. Grant assistance in partnership with other funders, will leverage investments to provide a high quality of life for Manitobans.

#### Projects in the following areas:

- planning activities that inform community or regional decision making about priorities and plans for future development
- capacity building of organizations with the intent of acting on identified community issues, realizing on development opportunities, enhancing charitable giving and volunteerism, and improving community well-being and stability
- community or regional initiatives that enable communities or regions to initiate local actions that address identified needs or opportunities
- Projects can span a maximum of two fiscal years (April 1-March 31). Project completion dates will be established in the project contribution agreement.
- capital infrastructure that supports new community, culture, and recreation development, as well as projects that extend, improve, or enhance existing public use community facilities and spaces

#### Funding formula:

- Maximum provincial contribution of 50 per cent of eligible project costs incurred to complete the project, up to a maximum grant of \$75,000.
- For capital projects with eligible project costs of over \$150,000 (larger capital) two contractors' quotes/estimates will be required
- A minimum non-government contribution of 10 percent is required for all projects, except planning projects.
- Non-government sources can include funds raised through fundraising activities, donations from individuals, businesses, charitable organizations, community foundations and service clubs.

Green Team creates summer employment opportunities for youth aged 15 to 29 years. - The maximum grant per applicant, as determined by the Fund, over a fiscal year is \$200,000.

## FEDERAL GRANTS

### New Horizons for Seniors Program

The community-based stream of the New Horizons for Seniors Program (NHSP) is a federal grant that supports community-based projects that are designed by seniors for seniors. This program funds projects that empower seniors in their communities and contribute to improving their health and well-being.

Eligible organizations can apply for up to \$25,000 for projects that are led by seniors and are volunteer based.

#### **Program objectives**

Projects submitted for this grant (up to \$25,000) must meet at least 1 of the following program objectives:

- promoting volunteerism among seniors and other generations
- engaging seniors in the community through the mentoring of others
- expanding awareness of elder abuse, including financial abuse
- supporting the social participation and inclusion of seniors
- providing capital assistance for new and existing community projects and/or programs for seniors

**If your proposed project is requesting capital assistance, it must meet at least 2 program objectives.**

## FEDERAL GRANTS

### Canada Summer Jobs (wage subsidy)

Canada Summer Jobs (CSJ) provides wage subsidies to employers from not-for-profit organizations, the public sector, and private sector organizations with 50 or fewer full-time employees, to create quality summer work experiences for young people aged 15 to 30 years.

The CSJ program objectives align with the redesigned Youth Employment and Skills Strategy and are as follows:

- provide quality work experiences for youth (15 to 30 years of age at start)
- respond to national and local priorities to improve access to the labour market for youth who face unique barriers
- provide opportunities for youth to develop and improve their skills

Not-for-profit employers are eligible to receive funding for up to **100%** of the provincial or territorial minimum hourly wage.

- Funding confirmations will be sent to employers starting in April 2023
- The earliest job start date is April 24, 2023
- The latest job start date is July 24, 2023
- The latest job end date is September 2, 2023

### CO-OP Community Spaces

#### ELIGIBILITY

##### Applicants eligible for funding include:

- Registered charities under the Canada Revenue Agency with valid registration numbers
- Registered non-profit organizations under their provincial government with proof of registration (e.g. letters of incorporation)
- Non-profit organizations partnered with their municipal government who will accept funding and issue receipts on their behalf
- Community service co-operatives

##### Projects eligible for funding must:

- Be available and accessible for community use
- Align with one of the three funding categories (recreation, environmental conservation, or urban agriculture)
- Be completed within two years
- Be a capital project
- Be in Manitoba (or British Columbia, Alberta, Saskatchewan)
- Provide the opportunity for permanent signage

### The Winnipeg Foundation Community Grants

To be eligible for a grant from The Winnipeg Foundation, your organization must have a registered charity number and your project must primarily serve the citizens of Winnipeg.

### Thomas Sill Foundation

Registered charities may obtain an application form by phoning or emailing the Foundation office, at which time a preliminary discussion will determine eligibility. Grants awarded may be capital, operating or project in nature. Successful applicants must wait two years before submitting another request.

There are no deadlines by which applications must be submitted. The Foundation meets regularly to render decisions and attempts to process completed applications within two months of receipt of application.
